SCHOOL SPECIFIC RULES

Non-authorized absences and early departures

The students are not authorized to leave the campus during or before the end of the school day. If a child should leave for lunch or leave school early, the parents must give written permission in case of a non-accompanied outing. If an adult comes to get the child for lunch or before the end of the school day, they are required to visit the office before leaving. In addition, we ask parents to contact the school office for any changes to the usual transportation of their child before 2:30.

Dress Code:

- The dress code is inclusive and gender and/or identity expression will be respected,
- Clothing does not contain messages of a violent, sexual, sexist, racist nature or promoting an object or illicit substance,
- Clothing is suitable for school activities and the weather,
- Clothing must hide private parts and underwear,
- Shoes must be tied to the feet. (open sandals such as flip flops are not acceptable),
- Running shoes are mandatory for physical education sessions.

Electronics at school:

All electronics not provided by the CSF are prohibited at school. These electronics are allowed on the buses and should be put away in the child's backpack for the rest of the day. Including iPod, smart phones, games etc. Communications between parents and children must go through the school office.

Failure to follow the school rules, the code of conduct will be enforced according these directives:

Principles of intervention

- It is expected that students will respect the code of conduct, not only at school but during all educational fieldtrips.
- The principles of positive and progressive discipline are applied: The consequences will be, as much as possible, related to the act in an age appropriate manner and according to the context.
- In case of serious and/or repeated problems, the child will be sent to the principal.
- Suspension is an exceptional measure that will be used only as a last resort.
- The behaviors are targeted.

Possible consequences:

- Fill out a reflection sheet.
- Receive a phone call at home.
- Take time to reflect on behavior.
- Get involved in a restitution meeting related to the offense.
- Lose some privileges.
- Follow a Personal Intervention Plan to help fit more harmoniously in the school life.
- Meet with the principal, possibly with parents.
- Be suspended inside or outside of the school.

Some behaviors that are major offenses:

- Physical abuse,
- Verbal and emotional abuse,
- Any discriminatory act,
- Bullying (repetitive abuse),
- Direct defiance to authority,
- Vandalism,
- Theft,
- Possessing a weapon,
- Use of an object to threaten a person,
- Possession or use of drugs / alcohol / tobacco / vaping,
- Being under the influence of drugs / alcohol,
- Visit and/or use of inappropriate websites.

In case of major offenses, the student may receive:

- a suspension inside the school,
- a suspension outside the school.
- police intervention or be referred to an outside service

**** An intoxicated parent or visitor should not show up at school.**
